If you need emergency medical care while in Noosa, it's important to know how healthcare works in Australia.

Public vs. Private Hospitals – What You Need to Know

Public Hospitals – If you have a Medicare card or are from a country with a reciprocal healthcare agreement, you may receive treatment at a public hospital with little to no cost.

Private Hospitals – Noosa Private Hospital operates as a private facility. Fees apply to all non-Medicare patients, including backpackers and travellers.

Noosa Private Hospital Emergency Fees

- Minimum of \$500 for an initial emergency visit
- Additional charges for tests, pathology and follow-up care
- Payment is required upfront, even if you have travel insurance (you can claim reimbursement later)

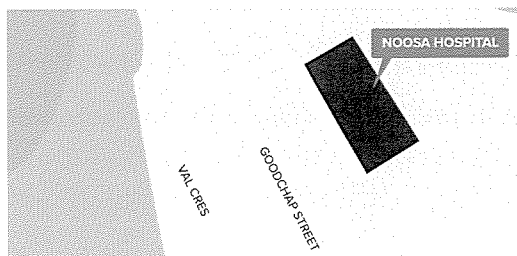
